Extra Long Weekend: Today is our Pupil Free Day, so we hope you and your child/ren are enjoying the dunny weather. Teachers will be looking at some new resources focussed on student engagement and pedagogy and resources aligned with our new school impact plan (which we will be communicating to you all very soon!).

NAPLaN Tests: In the next two weeks, our Year 3 and Year 5 students will take the National Assessment Program - Literacy and Numeracy (NAPLaN) tests. These tests assess important skills like reading, writing, spelling, grammar, and numeracy. The results help us understand how well our programs are working and identify areas where students may need more support.

While NAPLaN provides useful information, it is just one of many tools we use to understand student learning. At Hillcrest, we believe that NAPLaN does not determine your child's future. It does not measure how clever, kind, artistic, or athletic your child is. Please remind your child of their many strengths.

The best support you can give your child in preparation for these tests, is to:

- Reassure them that you are proud of them for their many wonderful qualities.
- Encourage them to take their time during the test.
- Remind them to read carefully and think before answering.

As parents and teachers, we only ask that they try their best. Their worth is much more than a test score, so please do not put too much pressure on them.

Enjoy the extra long weekend, and we look forward to seeing everyone back at school on Tuesday, 11h March.

I look forward to a fun year ahead with all our clever cookies!
















A busy start to the year...







Exciting times ahead!
