What's been happening in room 9?

Year 5 and 6 Science

The year 5s in room 9 have been investigating the different types of weathering for science, conducting investigations which explored geological changes. Similarly, the year 6s have been examining the seasons through the creation of 3D models of the Earth, identifying, describing and explaining how the axial tilt causes some parts of Earth to be exposed to more direct sunlight depending on where the Earth is on its orbit around the sun. We integrated this with HASS, looking at similarities and differences between Australia (in the Southern Hemisphere), and an Asian country in the Northern Hemisphere. This affects daily activities including what we eat, wear and do; as well as agricultural (farming) practices, where we get our food from, seasonality and the availability which can influence costs e.g., scarcity vs. glut; as well as cultural events (how we might celebrate Christmas, Easter, Eid, Holi, Diwali, birthdays, etc.) which we be exploring further.

Year 6 Space Science





The year 6s measured the relative scaled distance of each planet from the Sun. After students used a tape measure and a trundle wheel, they noticed that the Jovian planets were much further away from the Sun than the terrestrial planets. They are held in their orbits due to gravitational forces. Great job, room 9!
